

The CONSTITUTION of The Libertarian Party of Palm Beach County

THE CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE I Name & Object

Section 1.

The name of this organization shall be the Libertarian Party of Palm Beach County, hereinafter referred to as the LP Palm Beach.

Section 2.

The object and purpose of LP Palm Beach is to engage in political action in Palm Beach County and to serve as a county affiliate organization of the Libertarian Party of Florida.

Section 3.

The purpose of the LP Palm Beach is to implement and give voice to the principles embodied in the Statement of Principles currently adopted by the Libertarian Party by:

1. Supporting and endorsing Libertarian candidates for national, state, and local public office.
2. Entering into political information activities, including the promoting and securing of party members.

ARTICLE II Membership

Section 1.

LP Palm Beach membership is open to whoever signs the pledge: "I hereby certify that I do not believe in or advocate the initiation of force as a means of achieving political or social goals.", is registered to vote as a Libertarian in Palm Beach County, resides in Palm Beach County, Florida, and is a member of the Libertarian Party of Florida.

ARTICLE III Officers, Executive Committee & Standing Committees

Section 1.

The Officers of the LP Palm Beach shall be a Chairperson, a Vice-Chairperson, a Secretary, an At-Large, and a Treasurer. To serve as an officer of LP Palm Beach, one must be a member for at least 60 days prior to the annual meeting to which they are elected. The duties and election of the Officers shall be specified in the By-Laws.

Section 2.

The Executive Committee shall be composed of the Officers elected at the Annual Business Meeting within the provision of the By-Laws. It shall prescribe the powers and duties of the Executive Committee in the By-Laws, to provide the control and management of all the affairs,

properties, and funds of the LP Palm Beach consistent with this Constitution. Deficit spending shall be prohibited.

Section 3. Standing Committees

The Chair of the LP Palm Beach shall appoint committees and Committee Chairs with the approval of the Executive Committee unless otherwise provided in the Constitution. Actions of all committees shall be reported to the Executive Committee.

Section 4. Rules Committee.

The Rules Committee will be composed of the Chair, Secretary, and three (3) other members of the party not on the Executive Committee, one of the Chair shall appoint annually to serve a three-year term. The appointed members with the longest tenure on the Committee shall chair the Committee. The Rules Committee shall interpret the Constitution based on current Florida Statutes and upon order of the Executive Committee shall prepare and submit amendments to the Constitution and By-laws for a vote by the membership at the Annual Business Meeting.

ARTICLE IV Conventions & Meetings

Section 1.

The LP Palm Beach shall hold an annual convention under the provisions of the By-Laws.

Section 2.

The conduct of the business and meetings of the Executive Committee shall be prescribed in the By-Laws.

ARTICLE V Statement of Principles, Platform & Nominations

The Statement of Principles of the Libertarian Party is hereby ratified. The LP Palm Beach may develop a Statement of Principles consistent with the Libertarian Party's as a preamble to the Platform developed by the Convention, and as prescribed by this Constitution and By-Laws.

ARTICLE VI Adoption & Amendments

Section 1.

This Constitution shall be adopted when approved by two-thirds of the delegates of its Annual Business Meeting.

Section 2.

Amendments to the Constitution may be made in the following manner:

Amendments must be published among the Executive Committee and all members, thirty (30) days prior to the Annual Business Meeting and passed by a majority of more than 50.1% of the members present at that meeting, OR may be made from the floor at the annual meeting and passed with a majority of no less than 60%.
